Past/current experiences working in the field of disabilities:

I have been working with individuals with disabilities for six years and counting. I began working as a day rehabilitation aide at an after-school day program for children with autism or social, emotional, and behavioral disorders. Once in my Master's program, I began providing therapy based on Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) to children, adolescents, and adults with autism. After earning my degree and becoming a Board Certified Behavior Analyst, I began supervising those who provided ABA therapy and worked closer with the therapist and family of the client. As a doctoral student in Southern Illinois University's Behavior Analysis and Therapy program, I currently work with adolescents and adults with autism in helping them identify their values and assisting them in working through any challenges they encounter in pursuit of their values and meaningful activities.
